Dear Families and Friends,

It was great to see so many family members at the Fall Festival this year. Thank you for helping support the Manor by spending the afternoon with us. If I did not get to say hello, my apologies.

I am happy to report that the Manor did not receive a funding cut from the State. The State continues to experience significant financial difficulties which resulted in the loss of grant funded programs to many human service agencies, but the Manor does not operate under any of these grants. Unfortunately though, for the fifth consecutive year we did not receive an increase in funding. To counter our increasing costs against flat revenues we have taken several steps to control expenses. Over the past three years we have changed how we purchase utilities, joined larger purchasing organizations, changed our food providers, we monitor our insurance costs, and we have been forced to change our employee benefit programs. All of these measures have resulted in savings. I am grateful to our Board, the Finance Committee, and our Management Team for their efforts and support of the cost reductions. I also applaud our staff who have had the ability to look beyond themselves to the greater good of the men and the Manor. Everyone has made sacrifices to help close the gap between expenses and revenues. Thank you all.

I am saddened to report the passing of resident Rance Miedema. Rance was 63 years old and was truly a friend to all. He enjoyed helping others and working in the vocational program. Rance will be memorialized with a plaque in the main Chapel. We have also mourned the passing of Brother Victor. Our prayers and thoughts remain with the families of these two men.

We have been blessed with the presence, and good timing of Father Wolf Werling. Fr. Werling is a Diocesan Priest and has been at the Manor for a few months. He is presently teaching the men about Saints and is developing a Religion class that will be held twice weekly. Father celebrates Mass and he administers the Sacraments for those wanting to participate. In addition to his campus responsibilities Father has been visiting the men when they are hospitalized. In his spare time, Father Werling has been researching the history of our campus - St. Jude's Seminary, and is assembling a collection of memorabilia to be on display.

Earlier I thanked our Board Members and staff for their efforts toward balancing our budget. I would also like to thank the many supporters of our Mission and the men. Several families have donated funds to purchase automatic, natural gas fueled generators for the group homes. We are continuing this effort. Many families have increased their support of the Family Donor Program. We are also having more families provide perpetual support of the Manor by joining the Shepherds Endowment Society. While our needs are many and diverse, our blessings have been abundant. I thank you all for your blessings.

## Brother Victor Nolan - A Tribute to a Life Well-Lived

Born to Life                      December 16, 1922  
Born to Eternal Life        September 11, 2009

Brother Victor Nolan, a native of Albany, New York, was born to the late Agnes (Kent) and John Edward. He was one of three children, his brother John Edward, Jr. is deceased and he has one sister, Sister Victoria (Ann) who has been a Daughter of Charity for 72 years.

Since his entrance into the community on May 31, 1960, Brother Victor served this religious community and the people of God in a variety of capacities. He spent most of his religious life ministering to the poor and homeless at the facilities in Miami, New Orleans, Philadelphia, Oakland, Toronto, and Birmingham, England. Brother Victor was also assigned to the Cardinal Manning House of Prayer in Los Angeles. In many of his assignments Victor served dual roles as both superior of the local community and Director of Ministry. In his journey of giving, Brother Victor felt called to serve the church in another capacity and was ordained a Deacon in 1992. This same spirit of availability led Brother Victor to yet another decision. Keenly aware of the need for chaplains in BGS facilities, he was called by the community to enter the seminary and was ordained to priesthood on February 11, 1995.

In June of 2006 Brother Victor was assigned as Chaplain at Good Shepherd Manor. Given his many assignments and related responsibilities as brother, priest, friend, and servant, Brother Victor's life personified all of the charisms of adaptability, flexibility, availability, hospitality, and respect for life. Brother Victor completed perfectly well whatever was asked of him. He lived his life in the spirit of the Good Shepherd and the Brothers of the Good Shepherd founder, Brother Mathias Barrett.

**SUMMARY**

Clients are asked annually to rate their level of satisfaction with services provided by Good Shepherd Manor. The clients continue to respond positively to the satisfaction surveys. Clients expressed satisfaction with all areas measured this quarter. For the past 12 months, on average, all areas surveyed met or exceeded goal.

Community work or volunteering (# 4 and 5) is often a source of client dissatisfaction. This past year we have averaged about 57 men volunteering or working in the community each quarter. This exceeds our program goal of 51. This number has steadily increased over the past years by adding work and volunteer sites. As indicated by the men, community work is important to them and we will continue our efforts to obtain community work and volunteer opportunities.

This quarter the average satisfaction score with Day Program was 2.71; Residential was 2.77; General Services 2.75 on a 3 point scale. Overall client satisfaction was 2.74. For the quarter and the year clients are most satisfied with protection of their rights scoring 2.86 and 2.91 respectively.

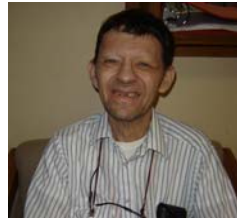
